It is important to keep in mind that every country requires different documentation (such as Passport, Government-issued Photo ID card, Driving licence/Driver's license, Birth certificate, Permanent residence card, Social security card, Medical/Health card, Voter registration card) that proves someone's identification (ID). In many countries such as Greece and Spain a national ID card is compulsory. Citizens are expected to have these cards on them at all times. However, in other countries ID cards are not required. Police and officials in these countries often use another system to identify people, such as asking for two pieces of ID.
